

Troop 160 Summer Camp 2007 Information Sheet

Troop 160 Summer Camp 2007 is scheduled for the weeks of August **5-11** and **12-18**. The first week will be at Camp Bell, and the second at Hidden Valley Scout Reservation (HVSR). This package contains all of the forms needed to register for camp.

The following forms need to be completed and mailed to the Troop (some with payment):

All forms must be MAILED to the appropriate person listed on forms. We hope that this will avoid piecemeal collection of forms and payment that sometimes results in lost forms or money.

GENERAL INFORMATION

SPOKE Program – NEW

This year there is a new program for scouts age 14 and above. The scouts attend camp with the troop, but can opt to participate in special outings, including a Winnepesaukee kayaking trip (2 days), a peak bagger hike (2 days), mountain biking and rock climbing. More information on this program will be coming your way through emails and announcements at the Troop Meetings.

What to bring to Camp

A list of items to bring (and not bring!) to camp is in the Troop160 Guidebook. It is always preferable to label any and/or all of the items you can. This will make it easier to return items that get misplaced.

For those who will drive to camp to drop off or pick up their scouts

For drop-off, Scouts need to be at the Camp by 1:00 PM (Sunday August 5 at or Sunday August 12). BEING ON TIME IS ESSENTIAL because the Troop can't check-in until EVERYONE is present! Parents can pick-up their Scouts at 9:00 AM the last day of camp (Saturday August 11 or Saturday August 18). More information will follow.

Two-Week Campers and the Saturday between Camps

There is no program in either Camp Bell or Hidden Valley on Saturdays. For those scouts that are attending both weeks, the Saturday between the week at Camp Bell and the week at Hidden Valley is a day off. Families should come and pick up their scout for the day, go out to eat, do laundry, etc. Parents will need to arrive at 9:00 AM, and return by 5 PM. Any Scout planning on leaving camp with someone other than his legal guardian needs to make that request know to the Scoutmaster (preferably in writing). More information will follow.

Camperships

Troop 160 policy is that no scout should be excluded from summer camp due to financial hardship. Any family that is in need of financial assistance should speak to Troop 160 Committee Chair Steve Silva.

Refunds

Refunds (less a \$50/wk. administrative fee) are difficult to obtain unless there is a very compelling reason (the Camp's rule, not ours). There will absolutely not be any refunds after July 15, 2007.

MEDICAL FORMS (for Scouts & Adult Campers!)

The following information is taken from the Daniel Webster Council's camp website (www.dwcbbsa.org):

MEDICAL FORM

Each person staying in camp must have a current medical form, with a doctor and parent's signature. Each youth medical form mandated by the State of New Hampshire is good for 24 months. Adults over the age of 40 must have a physical annually. All units are requested to use the class III Medical Form that can be obtained by going to the FORMS section of this web site. Anyone who stays more than 48 hours in Camp MUST have a medical form on file with the health office.

A parent or guardian's signature must also be on the section that gives the camp the ability to hospitalize and treat a boy in case of an emergency when the parents cannot be reached.

The following sections of the medical form must be filled out completely.

Section I - Identification; Section II - Emergency Medical Info.; Section III - Parent Statement;

*Section IV - Immunization History; Section VI - Medical History; **Section V & VII MUST be completed by a doctor.***

ANY CAMPERS WHO DO NOT HAVE A PROPERLY COMPLETED MEDICAL FORM OR ARE MISSING A PARENT'S OR DOCTOR'S SIGNATURE MAY NOT STAY OVERNIGHT IN CAMP!! NO EXCEPTIONS!!

MEDICATIONS

State law mandates that all medication must be secured in the Health Lodge. All medications will be turned in to the camp nurse upon arrival. Only legal medications will be given to scouts. Legal medications are medications in their original containers with a doctor name, patient name, administration instructions and date on the label. If for some reason the dosage changes, you will need a doctor's note.

MEDICAL FORMS ARE DUE TO THE TROOP BY **MAY 17, 2007**. PLEASE MAKE APPROPRIATE ARRANGEMENTS (i.e., early appointments) FOR ANNUAL PHYSICALS.

A BSA Class 3 medical form is enclosed in this package. A form is also included in the Troop 160 Guidebook.

BUS TRANSPORTATION TO & FROM CAMP

If we have enough riders to cover the cost of the bus, Troop 160 will run a bus up to Griswold Scout Reservation on August 5 and back to Lexington on August 18. The bus is typically a school bus rented from one of the local school bus companies, and is driven by one of the school bus company's drivers. The troop sends at least one adult on the bus along with the scouts. Availability is on a first come first served basis.

UNLESS THE TROOP INFORMS YOU THAT THERE WILL NOT BE A BUS, YOU SHOULD ASSUME THAT WE HAVE ENOUGH RIDERS AND THAT THERE WILL BE A BUS ON THE SPECIFIED DATES.

TO RESERVE A RIDE ON THE BUS, MAKE PAYMENT USING THE "FINAL REGISTRATION AND BUS RESERVATION FORM", DUE April 26th.

Payment for the bus also covers rental of the truck to transport the scouts' gear.

The bus departs the St. Brigid parking lot at 10:30 A.M. on Sunday, August 5, and returns to the St. Brigid parking lot at noon on Saturday, August 18. Times are subject to change! Confirmation of times and additional information will follow.

Scouts should wear their Class A uniform on the bus and have in a day pack: their Troop 160 Class B shirt, a bag lunch, a full water bottle, medications (to be checked in with the Camp Nurse), a swim suit and towel.
